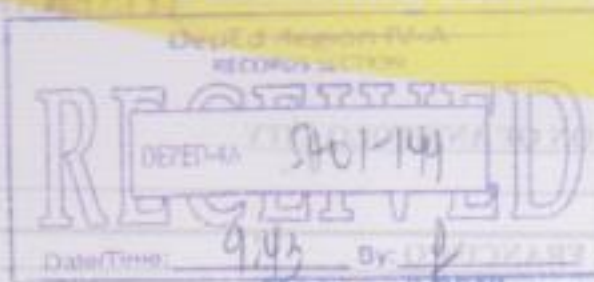

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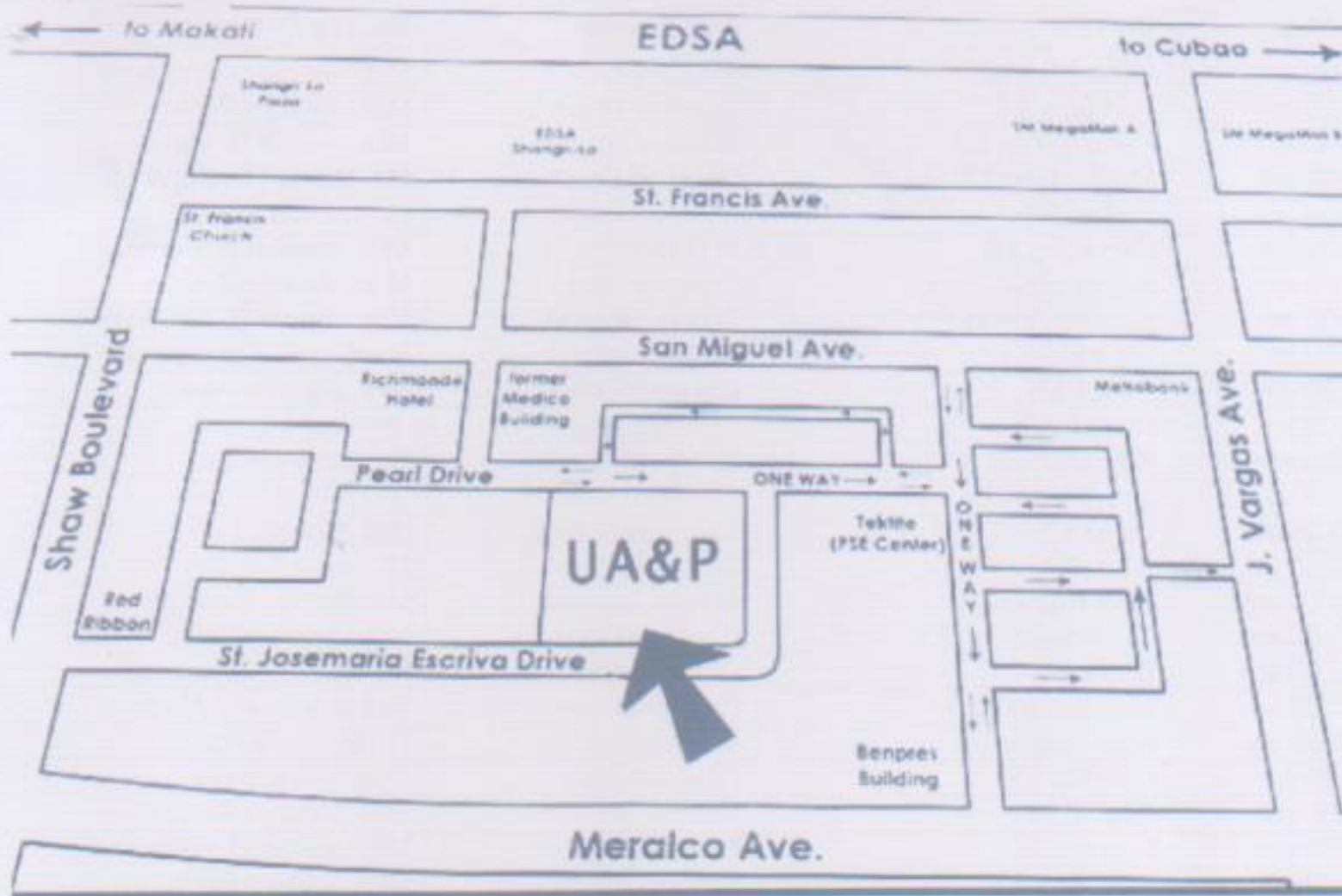

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE SPEAKERS



DR. W. BRAD JOHNSON is a Professor of psychology in the Department of Leadership, Ethics and Law at the United States Naval Academy, and a Faculty Associate in the Graduate School of Education at Johns Hopkins University. A clinical psychologist and former Lieutenant Commander in the Navy's Medical Service Corps, Dr. Johnson served as a psychologist at Bethesda Naval Hospital and the Medical Clinic at Pearl Harbor where he was the division head for psychology. He is a fellow of the American Psychological Association and recipient of the Johns Hopkins University Teaching Excellence Award. Dr. Johnson is the author of numerous publications including 13 books, in the areas of mentoring, professional ethics, and counseling. His most recent books include: *Athena Rising: How and Why Men Should Mentor Women* (2016, with David Smith), *On Being a Mentor* (2015), and *The Elements of Mentoring* (2008, with Charles Ridley).



MS. ANN ROLFE is the Founder of *Mentoring Works*. She is Australia's most published author on mentoring, and has thirty years experience in learning and development and a background in career counselling. For two decades, she has specialised in mentoring, setting up programs and training people in fields as diverse as health, construction, energy, communications, education, law and government. Her programs have won awards for innovation and excellence. Internationally respected as a trainer, consultant and presenter, Ann has spoken international conferences in Australia, Canada, China, Philippines, Singapore and USA. She runs regular webinars that attract participants from around the world and she served on the board of the International Mentoring Association.



DR. JEAN RHODES is a leading expert on youth mentoring research, and the depth, breadth, and rigor of her academic accomplishments have made important contributions to policies affecting children and youth. Rhodes is the Frank L. Boyden Professor of Psychology and the director of the Center for Evidence-based Mentoring at UMass Boston. Rhodes has published her findings in outlets ranging from scholarly journals to OpEds in *The New York Times* and *The Boston Globe*. Her trade book, *Stand by Me: The Risks and Rewards of Mentoring Today's Youth* (Harvard University Press), served to galvanize an emerging field. Rhodes launched longitudinal research on natural mentoring relationships with urban adolescents, deepening our understanding of the changing nature of relationships and their positive influence on an array of outcomes.
